- 1) downtown Manhattan which is the quarter of finance and business. It lies from the southern tip of the island to the 14th ~~avenue~~ street.
- 2) Mittertown Manhattan from the 14th street to 110th street. It includes

most of theaters, restaurants, public-buildings and some residential-houses

3) Uptown Manhattan: it is the residential-quarter on the ~~west~~ side

4) Harlem, ^{the Negro-section} quarter which includes 300.000 people of all races *mainly black*
