Trois cartes ont des inscriptions manuscrites (illisibles) à l'encre. 2 règles possibles: règle conventionnelle est de former des "familles", l'autre, appelée "Bachelor girl game" est une version plus moderne du jeu. Ce dernier se joue de 2 à 8 joueurs et consiste à faire des paires, les joueurs devant totaliser 100 points pour gagner.



BACHELOR GIRL GAME

1894/61

NOTE: Rules for playing the conventional *Old Maid Game* will be found on one of the cards in the deck. The following rules are for another and more modern Old Maid Game, "Bachelor Girl", to be played with the same cards.

The game may be played by two to eight players. If 2-3 or 4 are playing, deal six cards to each player. If 5-6-7 or 8 are playing, deal five to each. After dealing, place the remainder of the deck face down in the center of the table.

The dealer plays first. If two cards in his hand match, place them face up in front of you, then place another face up, draw one from the deck.

The player at your left plays next and on. When it is your turn to play, if you haven't a pair that match in your hand, others have laid down cards which match ones held in your hand, you take them and lay them with yours in front of you. The Old Maid or Bachelor Girl is wild and you may take another card and your wild and match it with the Bachelor Girl if you have it in your hand. Anytime you take Bachelor Girl by putting the matching card down in its place.

The player lays down a card and some one has the matching card in front of him, the player first noticing the error, then both cards and add them to the ready in front of them.

If a player lays down the last card in a hand he does not draw from the deck in laying down the final card hand he has won the hand and all other players give the winner the cards in their hands.

When you score you count five for a card in front of you and one for each single card. If the winner of the hand gets Bachelor Girl from one of the other players it adds ten points to his score.

The player getting 100 points first is the winner of the game.
