Walter This is not a bottle. This is an umbrella.
Connie An umbrella!
Walter This is a box. This is not an umbrella. This isn't an umbrella.
Connie This is a window. This isn't a door. That is a door. What is that?
Walter This is a lamp. What is that?
Connie This is not a lamp. This isn't a lamp. This is an iron. This is an umbrella. This is my umbrella.
Walter Yes, Connie, that is your umbrella.
Connie This is a razor.
Walter This is my razor.
Connie That is my umbrella. It is my umbrella.
That is our razor. It is your razor. Is this a clock?
Walter Yes, it is a clock. Yes, it is. Is that a clock?
Connie No, it isn't a clock. No, it isn't.
Walter What is that?
Connie Yes, what is it?
Walter It is an iron.

(Today Walter and Connie are working in a shop. A customer comes into the shop.)

Connie Good morning, Mrs. Black.
Mrs. Black Good morning. What's this?
Connie It's an apple.
Mrs. Black What's this?
Connie It's an orange.
Mrs. Black Who are you?
Walter I am Walter.
Connie Yes, he is Walter, and I am Connie.
Walter Connie, who is she?
Connie She is Mrs. Black.

(Mrs. Black notices Mr. Brown, who owns the shop.)

Mrs. Black Who is that?
Connie That is Mr. Brown. He is Mr. Brown.
Mrs. Black Is that tea?
Connie Yes, that's tea. It's tea.
Mrs. Black What's that?
Connie It's coffee.
Mrs. Black Is that coffee or tea?
Connie It isn't coffee or tea, it's sugar.
Mrs. Black Is that bread?
Connie Yes, it's bread. And this is cheese.
Mrs. Black Is this cheese or butter?
Connie It's butter.

Mrs. Black: Is this rice or flour?
Connie: It's rice. This is flour. And that's milk.
(Another customer comes in.)
Miss Green: Good morning.
Walter: Good morning.
Mrs. Black: Who is that?
Walter: That's Miss Green. This is coffee. This is tea. This is an egg, and this is an egg. This is salt. This is sugar. That's rice. And you are Miss Green!

Small Burglar: Yes, there's a knife behind the loaf.
Large Burglar: Where is the butter?
Small Burglar: On a plate behind you. And there are eggs in this dish.
Large Burglar: How many eggs are there?
Small Burglar: There are four.

Connie: You have a knife.
Walter: I have a fork. I have a knife and a fork.
Connie: You have a knife and a fork.
Walter: Have you a spoon?
Connie: Yes, I have a spoon. Yes, I have.
Walter: This is a plate. And this is a plate.

Policeman: Who are you?
Walter: I am Walter. We are Walter and Connie.
Policeman: Which is Connie?

Large Burglar: Have you any beer?
Connie: No, I have not! No, I haven't.
Large Burglar: She hasn't any.
Small Burglar: We haven't any beer, but we have some coffee.

Policeman: You are her husband. Walter is Connie's husband. Connie is Walter's wife. She is his wife.
Walter: Yes, we are husband and wife.
Policeman: Is this your house?
Walter: No, this isn't our house. But that is our car.
Policeman: Which is your car?
Walter: That's our car.
Mrs. Clark: That's the car.

(They have arrived at the place where they are going to have their lunch. Walter sits down on the ground.)
Walter: Connie, where is my pipe?
Connie: Your pipe is here.
Walter: Where is my tobacco?
Connie: Your tobacco is there.
Walter: Oh yes, thank you. And where are my matches?
Connie: Your matches are here. And your hat is there on the ground.
(The boys have disappeared.)
Walter: Where are those two boys?
Connie: Yes, where are Richard and William?
Walter: Where is that small boy, Tommy?
Connie: And where is the basket?
Walter: Oh, it's there, on the ground under the tree.

Walter: And Tommy is there!
(And the food is in the basket. Tommy, where are the cakes?)
Small Boy: They are in this box.
Walter: One, two, three, four, five.
Connie: Six, seven, eight, nine -
Walter: Tommy, where is that cake?
(Tommy is holding the cake behind his back.)
Small Boy: Ten!
(Connie starts to put the lunch on a table.)
Connie: The cloth is on the table.
Walter: The plate is on the cloth.
Connie: The knife is on the plate.
(And the cakes are in the box. Where's Tommy?)
Walter: He is under the table.

Walter: This room is ours.
Connie: And whose room is that?
(A large woman joins them.)
Woman: That room is ours.
(Walter takes the wrong one.)
Woman: That case is mine. Those cases are yours.
(Walter and Connie are now on the beach.)
Walter: Whose towel is that?

Man: Now you've got the parcel.
Walter: Yes, now I've got it. It's a big parcel.
Man: You must write your name here.
Walter: Must I? I haven't got a pencil. Can I have your pencil?
Man: Yes, you can have my pencil. Here it is.
Walter: Can you hold the parcel?
Man: Oh, no. You must put it down.
Walter: I must take the parcel to this address. Can you read it?
Man: No, I haven't got my glasses.
Walter: Now I can read it. It's in Hampstead. I must take the parcel to my wife. Oh! She has got the car. I must take the bus.
Man: I'm going now. Good afternoon.
(The man leaves. Walter takes the parcel and goes to catch a bus.)
Walter: Here is the bus.
(Walter gets on the bus.)
Walter: Can I sit here, please?
Conductress: Yes, you can sit there.
Walter: Can I put this parcel on the seat?
Conductress: No, you must hold it.
Walter: Can I have a ticket to Hampstead, please?
Conductress: We're not going to Hampstead today. We're only going to Baker Street. We're going to Hampstead tomorrow.
Walter: You're going to Hampstead tomorrow?
Conductress: Yes, we're going to Hampstead tomorrow. And we're going there next week, too.
Walter: But I must go to Hampstead now.
Conductress: Then you must get on that bus there. That bus is going to Hampstead today.
